## 5. How to participate

### **Sign up for the Competition**

All eligible groups and individual students are welcome. Please sign up for the competition with your Chinese teacher at school, or register online individually. Links to the **Online Registration** are available in **Section 9**. *Please note, parents' consent is required.*

### **Online Video Submission**

All participating groups and/or individual students are required to prepare a 3-5 minute Chinese cultural talent performance, plus a one-minute minimum short introduction in Mandarin Chinese, both filmed in video and submitted online. (See instructions in **Section 9**)

*A judges' panel will review all the video entries and select winners in both group and individual contests, based on the judging criteria, that includes content, creativity, originality, and presentation. The fluency and delivery of Chinese will also be considered.*

**This is a full virtual event and no on-site contest will be organized. However, the winners may be invited to an awards-giving ceremony if it is safe to have gatherings in Auckland.**

### **6. Dates**

- **Thursday 1 Sept 2022**                      Winners selected and announced

### **7. Eligibility**

- 1) Full-time enrolled primary and intermediate school (including home schools) student (Year 1-8, or age 14 and below) in the wider Auckland region (including Waikato and Northland).
- 2) For individual contestants, the student must be a New Zealand citizen or New Zealand permanent resident (non-Chinese citizenship).
- 3) For individual contestants, the student's native language must NOT be Chinese. Neither parents (including grandparents living with the student) should be native speakers of Chinese.

### **8. Awards**

- The top winner in the Individual Category will be selected to represent Auckland, New Zealand to participate in the international Chinese Bridge Competition online. (details TBC)
- Various awards will be presented to the individual and group winners. Selected winning video clips will be posted online.
