1. Introduction

This annual speech competition aims to provide tertiary students of Chinese with an opportunity to showcase their Chinese language proficiency, to create a platform of shared learning and communication, to further encourage their interest and enthusiasm in studying Chinese, and to enhance their understanding of Chinese language and culture.

4. Topic

5. How to participate

1) All eligible students are welcome. Please register online (registration link in Section 8).

- 2) Record a 3-5 minute original speech in Mandarin Chinese and submit the speech video online.
- 3) The top 3 candidates will be selected by a judging panel, based on the judging criteria, which includes content, fluency, grammar, pronunciation, and presentation. The aesthetic quality of the video filming and editing will not be assessed by the judges' panel.
- 4) The three finalists will be invited for an audition on ZOOM. Times to be scheduled individually.
- 5) At the audition, the finalists will be asked to deliver their speeches, a China-related talent performance, and have a chat with the judges.
- 6) The final result will be announced after all the auditions.

6. Eligibility

- 1) New Zealand citizen or New Zealand permanent resident (non-Chinese citizenship).
- 2) The native language is NOT Chinese. Neither parents should be native speakers of Chinese.
- 3) Full-time registered tertiary students in the Auckland, Northland, and Waikato regions.

7. Awards

One winner will be selected by the judges' panel. He/she will represent New Zealand to compete in the international final competition in China (or as an online virtual event). International airfares, accommodation, transportation, and other related expenses in China will be funded by the host. *Please note that the China trip will be subject to international travel border controls.*

A few consolation prizes will also be awarded by the local organiser.
