The ICBC CUP Auckland Regional Speech Competition 2025

1. Aims:

- To provide a platform for secondary school students to demonstrate their ability of utilizing the Chinese language.
- To encourage secondary school students' interest and enthusiasm in learning Chinese and to enhance their understanding of Chinese language and culture.

2. Date:

13:00—17:00, Saturday 24th May 2025

3. Venue:

Level 0, Owen G Glenn Building Business School, The University of Auckland 12 Grafton Road, Auckland

4. Theme Topic:

Fly high with Chinese 追梦中文

5. Format:

The competition is divided into two categories based on the school year level.

I. Secondary Junior Category: Year 9-10

- 1) **Speech in Chinese**: This part is compulsory and should last in 2-3 minutes. The following aspects will be emphasized in judging the speech: content, fluency, grammar, pronunciation and presentation.
- 2) **Chinese talent show**: This part is also **compulsory** and should not exceed 3 minutes. Participants can choose to display their Chinese talent in a form of their own choice.

II. Secondary Senior Category: Year 11-13

1) Speech in Chinese: This part is compulsory and should last in 2-3 minutes. The following aspects will be emphasized in judging the speech: content, fluency, grammar, pronunciation, and presentation.

- **2) Question-Answer**: Participants are required to answer one question that is related to their knowledge of Chinese language and knowledge about China.
- **3)** Chinese talent show: This part is also compulsory and is an integrate component of the participant's overall performance. It should not exceed 3 minutes. Participants may display their Chinese talent in any form of their choice.

6. Eligibility:

- 1) New Zealand citizen (12-18 years old).
- 2) Born and brought up in countries and regions outside of China.
- 3) First language is NOT Chinese. Neither parent should be native speakers of Chinese.
- 4) Full-time enrolled secondary student in the wider Auckland region from Northland down to Waikato.

Participants must meet all above four eligible conditions.

7. Dress Code:

Participants are encouraged to wear traditional Chinese clothing. Alternatively, school uniforms or personal attire are also acceptable.

8. Registration:

The regional competition is open to all secondary school students in the wider Auckland region (including Waikato and Northland). Each school can register a maximum of six students in each category (Confucius Classroom schools are entitled for a few extra registrations where that is required). Schools are encouraged to organize their own preliminaries. Individual student should register with her/his Chinese teacher so that the teacher can complete the registration template (please refer to the separate attached Registration Template), submit the school group registration to Confucius Institute in Auckland email address: info@ci.ac.nz by Friday 9th May 2025.
